

A LOOK BACK

YOU MATTER. Two simple words with the power to change the world. At MATTER, we see this power come alive when people believe they matter and realize they have a unique, vital role in finding solutions to some of the biggest problems today. These dreamers and doers have big ideas for how they want to impact their communities. MATTER is privileged to come alongside these world-changers to kick-start their big ideas, helping them turn their dreams into reality.

In 2019, throughout twenty-one countries, the message of "you matter" rang out loud and clear. Our amazing donors, partners, supporters, and suppliers here in the U.S. and around the globe, believing the message for themselves, took it to heart, delivering health and hope to over two million people worldwide through healthy food, innovative education, refurbished hospitals, and life-giving nutrition gardens.

Let me share a few highlights from 2019:

MATTERbox

Our remarkable volunteers, over six thousand strong, packed and distributed more than 177,000 meals, using MATTERbox meal kits and snack packs, to children and families throughout the country experiencing food insecurity.

Additionally, we launched You MATTER Cooking, an online cooking resource featuring healthy recipes used in conjunction with our MATTERbox meal kits. Created primarily for youth, You MATTER Cooking was successfully implemented in classrooms, offering students a fun way to learn basic cooking skills while mastering healthy and delicious tasting recipes.

HOSPITAL & CLINIC

In 2019, working with our partners, we shipped 49 containers of medical equipment and supplies to hospitals and clinics on the front lines of scarcity and lacking quality healthcare in 21 countries, providing them the tools they need to care for the sick and injured with the dignity they deserve. Over two million people were impacted through this program worldwide.

In Arusha, Tanzania, we celebrated the opening of its first maternity and pediatric hospital. The state of the art, three-story, 60-bed hospital was made possible by MATTER donors and supporters.

AGRICULTURE

MATTER facilitated the second Regenerate Senegal agricultural conference at the Gorgui Dieng Center for Agricultural Excellence in Kebemer, Senegal. Several international experts in a variety of agricultural fields traveled to Senegal to spend the week with 50 farmers from Senegal, Liberia, and Zimbabwe to strategize on best practices for farming in desert climates.

The nutrition garden on the grounds of the Victoria Falls Hospital, Zimbabwe, continued to flourish. Established in 2018, it was originally slated to feed expectant and new mothers. But the garden has been so productive that it's now able to feed all hospital patients. In 2019, under the attentive care of the garden's manager, the garden yielded enough vegetables for over 4,300 meals for the hospital!

EDUCATION

The first MATTER Innovation Hub (MIH) became a reality in Victoria Falls, in 2019. Using Apple products and curriculum to teach coding skills combined with a student-centered, forward-thinking approach to education, the MIH offers some of the world's most disadvantaged youth a chance to compete in the high-tech world of tomorrow. The lead facilitator, Aubrey Chiwundura, was the first person in Zimbabwe (and possibly in all of Africa) certified by Apple to teach their exclusive curriculum of coding using robotic balls, drones, and physical and virtual coding blocks.

All this happened because people believed they mattered, believed their actions mattered, and believed others mattered.

It takes a lot of dedication, collaboration and hard work to create impact on this scale. I am extremely thankful to MATTER's donors, corporate and community partners, volunteers, and Board of Directors for bringing these big ideas to life so people here and around the world can live the full and healthy lives they deserve.


